One Page Checklist for Hosts



Stage .	1: You are thinking about nosting
	Find out about what is involved and discuss it with others in your household
	Find Government advice <u>here</u> and lots of other helpful info and videos <u>here</u>
Stage 2: You have decided you want to host	
	Register for our local <u>matching service</u>
	We will work to put you in touch with a possible match & you can both decide if it feels right
	Apply for visas: we can provide guidance and support
	Keep in touch with your guests and keep them informed. Invite them to the Guests WhatsApp
	Follow up: if there are any problems, we can chase the application for you
Stage 3: The visas are granted	
	Talk to your guests about travel arrangements and anything they may need when they arrive.
	Let us know what you need (SIM card, Foodbank items, clothing, etc)
	<u>Prepare yourselves</u> and <u>your home</u> for your guests' arrival (and get the <u>certificate!</u>)
Stage 4: Your guests arrive	
	If you cannot meet them, please let us know and we will try to find a volunteer to meet them.
	Help them settle in – read <u>this advice.</u>
Stage 5: Helping them get organised	
	Set up a bank account. <u>Ringwood High Street</u> (e.g. <u>NatWest</u>) banks are helpful but take many days
	to create the account. Revolut are fast. We recommend doing both.
	Get a National Insurance number
	Apply for <u>Child benefit</u>
	Apply for School places
	Register with a GP
	Apply for Universal Credit
	Let HCC know that your guests have arrived (they get £200 per person when HCC visit)
	Contact Red Cross on 08081 963651 (10am-6pm) for £50 support and other help
	Visit the <u>Job Centre</u> who can provide lots of advice and support
	Talk to your guests about how your house works, their expectations and yours
Stage 6: Going forwards	
	Organise the next <u>Foodbank</u> collection (if needed)
	Book Covid-19 <u>vaccinations</u> , if needed
	Signpost trauma support, for example <u>Sane Ukraine</u> or <u>Thrive LDN</u>
	Apply for the <u>3-year visa</u> (important: stay within the Ukraine Scheme)
	If required, register for an HMRC account (to check taxes)
	<u>Citizens' Advice</u> can provide useful information on benefits and other matters
	Duolingo offers free online courses for <u>English speakers to learn Ukrainian</u> – go for it!
	Keep learning - Hampshire libraries are offering lots of fascinating e-books about Ukraine
